

Visit The North Star Underground Railroad Museum

Discover the hidden history of the Champlain Line of the Underground Railroad and the compelling stories of fugitives from slavery who passed through North-eastern New York and the Champlain Valley on their way to Quebec and Ontario, Canada.

Museum displays include a multimedia production of the story of John Thomas who escaped from slavery in Maryland, exhibits depicting the debate over slavery and how it divided many of our churches, and a regional exhibit illuminating the lives of men and women who represented every stage of the anti-slavery struggle—from petition to war.

Educational and informational programs are regularly scheduled for children and adults throughout the summer. Each Saturday mini-tours of underground railroad sites in Keeseville and Peru leave the museum at 9:30 am. See our website www.northcountryundergroundrailroad.com for all available programs.
